



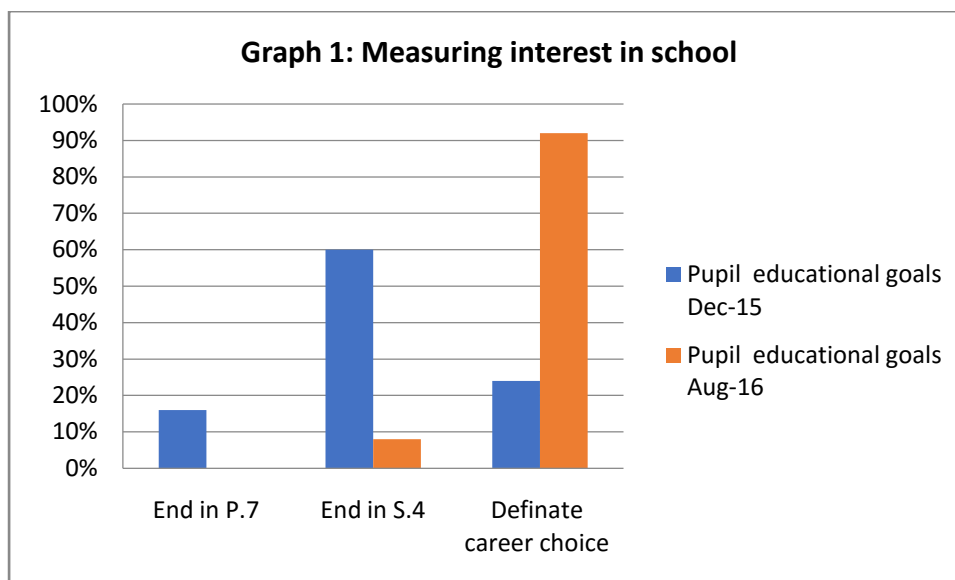
Securing Futures Africa Impact Brief I- change in AMBITION!

We work to spark off ambition and increase the interest of children in rural areas to stay in school longer. We use mentorship camps through which we demonstrate the value of education, expose children to the different persons they can be among others

Between **December 2015 and September 2016**, we worked with a cohort of 120 children in Akore primary school, Amuria district, north eastern Uganda. During this time, we held **3 mentorship camps** of two days each. Securing Futures Africa analyzed sets of commitment cards¹ filled by the children in Camp I of December 2015 and compared with those filled in September 2016 and noted the following changes

- 8% reduction in number of children leaving school in P5 and P.6
- 100% reduction in number of children aiming to end at P.7
- 67% reduction in number of children aiming to end in S.4
- 70% increase in number of children able to name a definite career path as a goal

There is a strong link between these changes and the messages passed over by Securing Futures. The summary of the changes is shown in graph one below:
